**Maryland K-12 Teachers to Descend on Federal Reserve for
Maryland Council on Economic Education (MCEE)/Federal Reserve Program**
*– Program part of MCEE’s efforts to educate teachers
to help them teach financial literacy to Maryland students –*

WHAT: 56 Maryland educators will participate in MCEE’s “Evening at the Fed”, a program between the Maryland Council on Economic Education and the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, Baltimore Branch to learn about monetary and fiscal policy and to receive teaching resources for the classroom from economic education staff from the Richmond Fed and MCEE.

R. Andrew Bauer, senior regional economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, will be the keynote speaker. Educators will also have time to exchange ideas with speakers and other educators around the state.

The event is free to all educators.

WHO: [Maryland Council on Economic Education](#) is Maryland’s nonprofit organization that improves economic and financial literacy in the state’s 24 local school systems grades K-12 by assisting with curriculum development, creating lesson plans, and training teachers. MCEE is co-hosting this annual “Evening at the FED” for teachers as part of its effort to train teachers to effectively teach financial literacy to Maryland students.
